Young People's Chorus of New York Is First Chorus In Residence at Jazz at Lincoln Center's Frederick P. Rose Hall

The Young People's Chorus of New York City begins a new relationship for the 2008-09 season with Jazz at Lincoln Center as the first chorus in residence at its home, Frederick P. Rose Hall, located at Broadway at 60th Street, New York City. With performances on three continents and five Choir Olympics gold medals, the multicultural Young People's Chorus of New York City (YPC), is recognized as one of today's finest and most influential youth choruses.

Young People's Chorus of New York City (YPC) was founded in 1988 by Francisco J. Núñez with a commitment to diversity and musical excellence, and today, more than 1100 children of all ethnic, religious, and economic backgrounds participate annually through the chorus's core after-school program and its Satellite program in New York City schools.

Jazz at Lincoln Center is dedicated to inspiring and growing audiences for jazz. Under the leadership of Artistic Director Wynton Marsalis, its productions include concerts, national and international tours, residencies, yearly hall of fame inductions, weekly national radio and television programs, recordings, publications, an annual high school jazz band competition and festival, a band director academy, jazz appreciation curriculum for students, music publishing, children's concerts, lectures, adult education courses, student and educator workshops and interactive websites.
